WORKSHOP #1: What Is DIBELS Next?

Time: 10:00 am – 12:00 pm

This workshop will offer an opportunity for teachers to become familiar with assessment measures which provide valuable information about each child's ability to perform tasks necessary for becoming a competent reader. Active discussions and practice will enable each participant to understand the procedures for administering the First Sound Fluency, Phoneme Segmentation Fluency and Nonsense Word Fluency indicators. Appropriate for educators working with students in grades kindergarten through grade 2.
